The Tyler Wentz Story

At 16, Tyler, or "T-Wentz", was the kid with a permanent smile. He was an easygoing, hard working, gentle, selfless soul who loved to make people laugh. Tyler was the rare person who put others before himself as proven by the many, many, stories of his quiet acts of kindness and generosity. "T-Wentz" had mad passion for his family, his sister Emily, his pets, many friends, 'merica, The Red Sox, Godwin High School, music, video games, and sports. Tuckahoe ball field became his "second home" and over three years he umpired hundreds of kids and was best known for his fairness, knowledge of the game, kind, positive words of encouragement, and helpful tips. When Tyler was 15 he coached what would be the first of 4 teams and took great pride in his "little guys." It was immensely important to him that he set a good example as a positive role model. In August of 2015, Tyler had an accident while body surfing with his best friend and spent 18 days in CVICU on life support. He did regain consciousness a few times and fought incredibly hard, however sadly he passed away due to complications. Tyler impacted hundreds of people of all ages, and it is important that we carry on his positivity, passion, goodness, and commitment to the community.
